# Research guidelines, questions (for the written text)

- What types of articles provoke most written reactions and most intensive virtual discussions in the comments section?
- Which issues concern people the most; what motivates people to express themselves on the 'electronic wall'; what makes the reader want to be heard?
- Which articles trigger the stepping out of indifference and what gives the impulse to make the effort of writing a comment at all?

• Or in other words: What AFFECTS people? What topics seem to intensify the interaction between the media message and the perceiving reader?



### **Examples:**

- Whole school staff is changed after cruel mistreatment of students. (Nomaina visu skolas personālu pēc cietsirdīgas izturēšanās pret audzēkņiem) → institutional problems, children.
- The prohibition to smoke near children is there to make parents think more responsibly; it will be difficult to control it. (Ar aizliegumu smēķēt bērna klātbūtnē 'klauvēs pie vecāku sirdīm'; kontroles iespējas knapas.) → norm, bringing up children.

## Preliminary findings

- Experience stories experience images
- Partial vision (not being able to see the cause of unease)
- Partial knowledge of past and future events

## Possible directions

- Link between article types, topics and image characteristics
- +Link between image characteristics and article popularity
- ++Link between image elements and Internet agressiveness index for comments section
